
Circular route

- 1 This walk can start in several places, Pooley Bridge, Dacre or Dalemain Mansion.
- 2 Starting from Dalemain, walk through the arch and past the tea rooms on your left. Keep right and walk down a tree-lined walled lane. Follow the track through a series of gates.
- 3 The track goes uphill with Dacre Castle at the top. Pass the farm building and the clockmaker's workshop to arrive at the castle.
- 4 The driveway leads you past the castle moat. Go through a gate left of a cattle grid and over a stile in the wall (just after the white cottage) taking you to the village of Dacre. Walk south through the village. The road goes uphill, and you will pass a slate bench. By a noticeboard, turn right following signs to Soulby.
- 5 Beyond the first farm is a green metal bench on your right. Opposite is a blue arrowed bridleway and a field gate you should go through. Follow the fence in the field down to the right-hand side, to a kissing gate.
- 6 Cross the A592 to the other side and climb over the stile signposted Dunmallard car park. Follow the hedge up the hill. At the top there is a wall with a stile. Once over, go left across the field to find another wooden stile in the hedge, cross that and follow the field upwards to a big stone. From there head towards woodland and through a small gate. Turn left and follow the signpost to Pooley Bridge through the woodland.
- 7 The walk takes you beside the banks of the river Eamont as you follow it downstream. The path veers away to the left and through a field where it meets the road again.
- 8 At the road, go left for a short while until a footpath on the opposite side of the road. Follow this path along the field boundaries all the way to Dacre Bridge. From the bridge it is a short walk back to Dalemain.

It's a relatively flat and family-friendly loop, with Dalemain Mansion & Historic Gardens and Dacre Castle en route, although not all stretches of the walk are suitable for pushchairs.
