

## Single route

- 1 Head out of the hotel and turn right in the car park, follow the paths down towards the lake shore and the marina and go through the wooden gate entering the Marina. Follow the yellow signs for the 'Hotel Walk' across the marina and into the fields on the other side. In the fields the yellow markers continue, follow these through the open fields. The footpath then narrows up to the main road.
- 2 At the road walk right until you reach the signpost to Watermillock church. Turn left. Take care on this stretch of road as it is between two blind bends. It is a fast road and is busy, particularly in the summer months. There is no pavement.
- 3 Continue up the road for about 1.5 km until you reach the Ullswater Way, just past the church on the left-hand side. It is signposted for Aira Force and the footpath sign displays the Ullswater Way daffodil symbol.
- 4 Follow the well-marked path. Once through the woodland, you will pass through a gate and reach the ruins of an old shooting lodge. Take the path south (left) following it to a viewpoint known as the Memorial Seat. From here follow the path to Aira Force.
- 5 When you arrive at Aira Force (you will know that you are in the area because you will be able to see the river below the path). It is a circular route. If you turn left, you can head down to the National Trust café and shop or you can turn right and walk to the waterfalls.
- 6 You can also extend this walk slightly if you cross the road from the National Trust car park and go through the wooden gate on the other side, this takes you down to the lake shore and the Ullswater Steamer landing jetty.

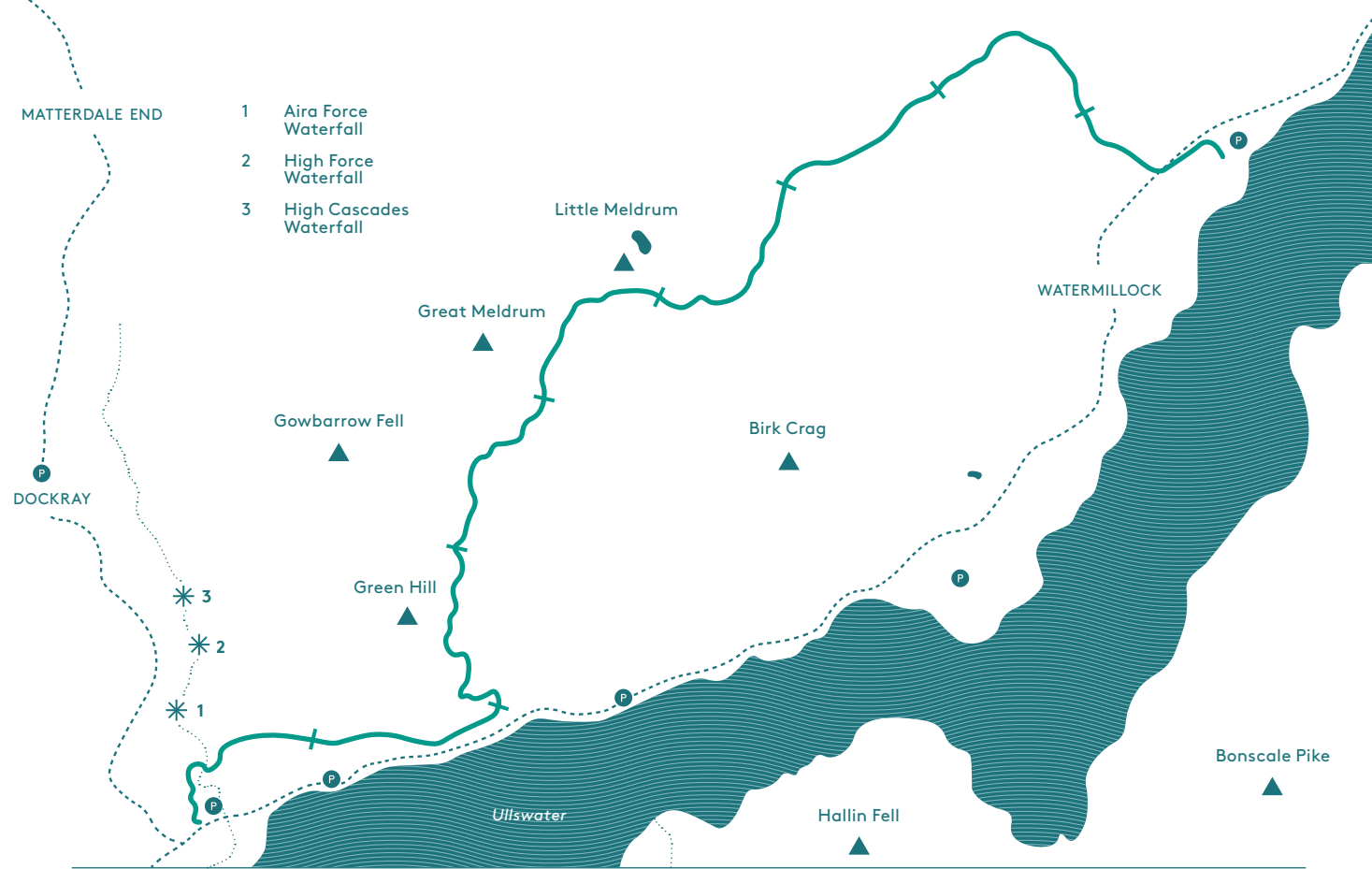

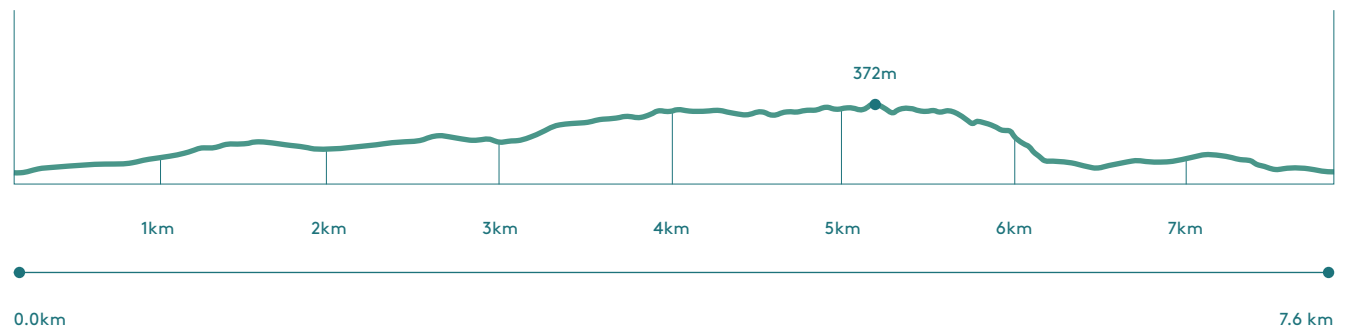
