## Circular route

- 1 Start at Aira Force National Trust car park on the A592 postcode CA11 0JS.
- 2 Leave the car park and head straight up the wellmarked footpath to the waterfall.
- 3 Once you've seen the waterfall, continue up the path along the right-hand side of the river, keeping the beck (stream) on your left. This leads up to a second waterfall, High Force, and continues past the trees into the open countryside of Gowbarrow Park.
- 4 Follow the path that runs along the edge of an old drystone wall until you reach a gate leading off uphill to the right (signed Gowbarrow). At the end of the wooded area, go through the gate and continue along the open path until you see a small wooded area on your right. At this point you will see the Ullswater Way daffodil signpost. Follow this route uphill, signed for Gowbarrow.
- 5 This section of the walk is the steepest and can be slippery when wet, so take extra care. The path will eventually level out. Just before reaching the summit, take a right turn at the fork in the path. Continue along until you reach the trig point (triangulation station) marking the summit of Gowbarrow Fell at 481 m.
- 6 To descend from Gowbarrow summit return on the path you came on. At the path junction just under the summit, turn right.
- 7 At the next path junction, continue around the front of Gowbarrow Fell towards the views across Ullswater, ensuring you don't enter the woods. As the path begins to turn south, the mountains above Ullswater will appear.
- 8 Take care as you descend as the path is steep and can become slippery when wet. As you take the last path junction into the woods, the path will rejoin the Aira Force Waterfall Trail. Once you have crossed the bridge, follow the signs to the car park.


